ENTERING HORT ENTRIES IN A FLOWER SHOW

At this time *next* year, MGC members will be working very hard on our GCA Flower Show entitled 'Perspectives' in Memphis on April 8. Coincidentally, the GCA Annual Flower Show is on April 8 *this* year. Our committee thinks this is a great opportunity. Our members can use the schedule for this year's GCA Annual Flower Show (which is attached) as a practice session for entering horticulture, and use that experience to eliminate much of the last-minute questions that arise as a flower show date nears:

- What will be growing in my yard in early April that fits a class definition in the show schedule?
- What do judges consider a ribbon-winning horticulture specimen?
- When should I cut and condition my entry?
- How do I identify my plant and complete the entry card, including how I propagated it?
- How do I groom it when I arrive at the flower show so that it looks its best?
- What is the role of the passing judge who must look at my entry before it is judged?
- What are the differences between entering cut entries and container grown entries?

We can use this year to learn and practice for next year's flower show. For first-time horticulture entrants, this will eliminate much of the mystery and give us all more confidence on April 8, 2022!

Our Horticulture Committee Members, who have much experience in entering horticulture, will answer all of the questions above during our forum. All you need to do to prepare for the forum is to read the attached Horticulture Section (Hort begins on page 17) of the GCA Annual Flower Show that will be held this April. You need some familiarity with flower show rules and organization of a horticulture schedule to understand the speakers.

MGC Spring Horticulture Workshop

March 4, 10:00 a.m. – noon Memphis Botanic Garden, Sara's Place

Topic: Adding Vines to the Garden Leaders: Suzy Askew and Kim Rucker







On March 4, Suzy Askew, retired Dixon gardening educator and designer and Kim Rucker, current Dixon horticulturist, will conduct the MGC Spring Horticultural Workshop on Vines. Attendees with be provided a booklet on vines written by Suzy and Kim to take home with them. Our leaders will discuss how to use vines in garden design, the structures that support the vines in the garden, and how they need to be tended. Suzy and Kim will present about ten of their favorite annual and perennial vines – how to propagate them, their best and less desirable features, and where they grow best. They are still winnowing down the list, but they have mentioned Jackson vine (Jackson vine-Native), cross vine (Native), sweet peas, hyacinth bean vine, cardinal vine, moon vine, passion vine (State Wildflower, Native), ladies' earrings(Native), hydrangea vine(Native), and black-eyed Susan vine. Each attendee will leave with small containers of vine seeds or cuttings on a tray that she planted and labeled herself!

The workshop will be held in Sara's Place at the **Memphis Botanical Garden** from **10-noon**. We will have box lunches immediately after the workshop.
