Julia Hussey invited Garden Groupies to her peony garden on April 22 to view her special collection of herbaceous peonies. Photos of these beautiful specimens are below. She also offered some advice provided below:

- Buy early bloomers or middle bloomers, but not late.
- Plant peony shallow. Never deep.
- Plant in full sun.
- Don't cut foliage until dormant.
- Cut leaves that have a fungus.
- Pinch off the early side buds so major blooms can get all the nutrients for larger flowers.
- Do Not Mulch in winter. Peonies must get very cold in winter in order to bloom the following spring.
- You can use mulch in summer to keep soil moist.
- Julia buys her peonies from David Reath. Search online.




DID YOU KNOW?
