

Dr. Richard Olsen, Director of the US National Arboretum is a recognized leader in public horticulture. Prior to his promotion to Director, he was a research geneticist and the Arboretum's lead scientist, where he focused on developing pest and disease resisitant urban landscape trees. This important work-including travel around the world to find and develop new plants for commercialization in the US-continues to benefit America's nursery and landscape industry!

The Phoebe Cook lecture series is co-sponored by the MGC and the Dixon Gallery and Gardens. This series provides an opportunity to bring outstanding speakers in horticulture, conservation, and floriculture to Memphis. This series was established and endowed by the late Phoebe Cook Welsh in memory of her mother, Phoebe Cook. Our newest MGC members were encouraged by Barton Lynch that they "CAN enter a flower show" during a tutorial she gave while guiding them through the floral design division of the LGC's 1st GCA Flower Show held at the MBG on October 20th. Barton began her presentation by holding up a paper copy of the LGC flower show schedule to the new members and introduced our members to the theme of the show and the 3 divisions present: floral design, horticulture, and photography. Barton further explained how floral design entries are judged, how the Yellow Book instills objectivity into the floral evaluation and pointed out for individual examination the judges' comments on the entry cards placed beside each entry. Containers were examined and instruction to "look for a rhythm in the art caused by line, color pattern, repetition of shapes or light" was given. Circling each floral design entry, reading the class descriptions aloud and listening to Barton's instruction helped each of us to better understand basic tenets, elements, and principles of floral design. We all learned something NEW about floral design and GCA flower shows from Barton and look forward to our own MGC Flower Show in April 2024!
