### Roberta Anderson | Horticulture

Get those flower pots ready for Rhythm & Hues! The photo on the left shows the white salts and minerals that exude from terracotta pots. The clean pot on the right has been gently scrubbed with a plastic bristle brush and rinsed. No need to take the plant out, just be careful. Prevent the buildup by using rainwater or distilled water. Although many gardeners like the look of a "weathered" pot, GCA judges do not! Another reason to keep your pots clean is dirty ones can harbor fungus and bacteria that can affect your plant's health.

Elizabeth Coors attended the GCA Floral Design Study Group in Savannah, GA, in October with instructor, Klaus Wagener. She will be entering the Atlanta Botanical Garden Flower Show, "Primavera", in February with Julie Spear. Elizabeth is entered in Memphis Flower Show 2024, "Rhythm and Hues", in April; and will be participating in The Garden Club of Houston's flower show, "Bayous in the City", in May.

Veazey Krausnick entered the Ladue Flower Show in Saint Louis last fall.

Brandon Morrison will be entering the Memphis Flower Show 2024, "Rhythm and Hues" in April and The Garden Club of Houston Flower Show, "Bayous in the City", in May.

Julie Spear was an assistant in October at the GCA Floral Design Study Group workshop in Savannah, GA, with German instructor, Klaus Wagener. She will be partnering with Elizabeth Coors in their entry at Atlanta Botanical Garden Flower Show, "Primavera", in February, as well as serving on a judging panel. Julie will also be judging at the 2024 Philadelphia Flower Show, "United by Flowers", in March; and she is entered in Memphis Flower Show, 2024, "Rhythm and Hues". In September, 2023, Julie taught a floral design workshop for the River Oaks Garden Club in Houston, and in November, 2023, she gave a floral design program and workshop for Memphis Garden Club members at Memphis Botanic Garden. Julie was also on the prep crew for the Phoebe Cook Lecture Series speaker, Sue McCleary, as well as assisted in her afternoon workshop following her morning program.

Barton Lynch judged at the Laurel Garden Club flower show, "The Gift" this past fall, and will be judging at the Atlanta Botanical Garden Flower Show, "Primavera", in February.

Barton is also chairman of the 120 judges who were selected to participate in Memphis Flower Show 2024, after they followed the new GCA guidelines for inviting judges to the GCA Annual Meeting flower show, the Memphis Major Flower Show and the Milwaukee Major Flower Show.

In October, 2023, GCA sent out an interest form which required all judges to list the flower shows they would like to attend. The form gave the judges one month in which to complete the form. This is a new procedure, and judges who had not submitted their forms by the end of November were eliminated from the list of potential judging invitees. Just FYI, Memphis Flower Show is so well-regarded throughout GCA that 276 judges from across the 12 Zones enthusiastically submitted their completed forms on time.
